# Gergely ILLYÉS Presidential Elections in Romania: Klaus Johannis and the "New Voters"

Since regime-change in Romania the country has held its seventh presidential election in 2014. The first round of elections held on November 2<sup>nd</sup> were inconclusive and none of the nominees were able to get an absolute majority of the votes. Thus it was necessary to hold a run-off election on November 16th. The electorate was surprised by the election of Klaus Johannis, whose victory resulted from the mobilization of "new voters." These voters voiced their opposition to the establishment political elite by voting for the newcomer. The large turn-out was enhanced by the vote of the Romanian citizens living abroad as guest workers. Their participation was surrounded by controversy since in both the previous election and the current election their votes played a critical role in determining the winner. The victory of Klaus Johannis has had a nation-wide impact on Romanian politics. For Romanian parties it has become clear that they cannot go back to "business as usual." They can appeal to the "new voters" only with a clear commitment to reform which aims at the common good of society.

# An Assessment of the County and Local Government Elections in Slovakia

Within one year Slovakia has held two local government elections: in November 2013 the county representative councils and the county presidents were elected and in November 2014 the local municipalities held their elections. In both these elections the governing Smer Party registered victory over the fragmented opposition of the right. In the competition for the support of the ethnic Hungarian voters the Magyar Közösség Pártja (Hungarian Community Party) proved to be more popular than the mixed Slovak-Hungarian Most-Híd Party.

# The Role of Conceptual Metonymy in the Conceptualization of the Peace Treaty of Trianon

The paper hypothesizes that the alternative conceptualization of the peace treaty of Trianon is the consequence of conceptual metonymies. To prove this statement ten texts written by Hungarians from 1990 to 2010 are investigated with the aim of identifying and analysing conceptual metonymies. The metonymic expressions are treated not on their own, but within their context. The corpus is carefully selected regarding different discourse types, and different degree of subjective and objective way of conceptualization. The main finding of the study is that close connection exists among discourse types, the degree of subjective and objective ways of conceptualization and the application of conceptual metonymies. The more an author conceptualizes the peace treaty of Trianon in an objective way, prototypically the better the likelihood is that the utterance belongs to academic discourse and the author applies PART FOR PART conceptual metonymies. If the writer conceptualizes the peace treaty of Trianon in a subjective way, prototypically the text belongs to social-political discourse with not only PART FOR PART but also with PART FOR WHOLE conceptual metonymies in it.

# Anikó NOVÁK Peeking into the Drawers of Granny's Cupboard. Museum Theoretical Approximation to Ottó Tolnai's Artwork

Literature and museums are connected by many threads. Aside from literary texts with the museum as their topic and museums that introduce literature the museological-theoretical approach to literature and the literary-theoretical approach to museums are both equally productive. The study's aim is to present a new approach to Ottó Tolnai's artwork that places collecting and museology at its centre. In my opinion this approach fits in with and extends from the inner-logic of the Tolnai-texts. Collecting and taking inventories are defining acts in the author's texts and can be found both as themes and as text-organizing procedures. The Hungarian author in Vojvodina builds his textual *Wunderkammer*, which is the place of joy in playful creation, and one of the most important elements of this universe is granny's cupboard.
