SUMMARY

The column of the Studies, Articles and Data begins with the article entitled "The Place of Onomatology Among the Social Sciences" by K. FABÓ. It claims that onomatology is a branch of science standing on the half way between linguistics and other social sciences. Its most important function - the identification - is carried out by the means of the language, but is still has several connections with other social sciences that are mostly undiscovered. The donymous work, the "Problems of Nicknames" begins with the study of the terminology of the Hungarian nicknames (epithets). It represents a detailed study of the internal classification. It distinguishes between the aim, the motive and the emotional atmosphere of sense of name giving and within these suggests separate classification.
