## SUMMARY

In the first study of the column entitled "Studies, Articles, Data" A. MEZŐ examines the name of a vanished village in Haidú county. In contradiction with other researchers he verifies that the name of the village dated from 1476 wasn't Nviregyháza, but Móregyháza named from one of St. Maurice. - J. SZABÓ derives the name of the village Nagykónyi from the Turkish Culun ('foal pullus equinus') proper name. - C. REUTER deals with the placenames begining with Ip-. He establishes that there are more possible explanations for the name, but he considers that explanation the most likely, which says that it comes from a proper name originating from the ip- 'father-in-law' common noun. - L. PÉTER writes in detail about the collection & explanation of the place names in connection with the book entitled The Monograph of Szőreg. - J. SZABÓ responds to a piece of article emphatizing the practical point of vieus in place name collecting. - M. HAJDU gives the conclusion by the right of the editor saying that two different opinions are opposed to each other, and both types of collections (of onomatology & of regional history) are needed, Now it is more urgent to save the names from falling into oblivion, then these names can be supplemented with archives. - L. BACHAT examines the use of place names in the language of children from 10 up to 18. He points out that most of the names shorten, or even get a derivative affix, out the associational name-changing is frequent as well. - K. J. SOLTÉSZ systematizes the proper names occuring in institution-names. She also deals with the functions & forms of proper names in them. - I. BORSA explains the development & usage of titles of nobility very briefly & clearly. - L. IVÁN examines the custom of naming twins in a village (Kecel) in the 19th century. He establishes that the most frequent names are Adam & Eva, and there aren't any other specialities. -

P. VILLÁNYI publishes some name-mocking verses from village Galgamácsa. — J. KISS compares the popular & the official naming of birds in Hungarian language. — J. Zs. PAPP enlists those mediaval Hungarian place names in which bird-names occur, or which developed from bird-names. — M. HAJDU continues his series of articles started in the 4<sup>th</sup> issue of Névtani Értesitő & now he systematizes the bull names of Békés county according to their meanings on the bases of data between 1925 & 1934.

The "Review" (Szemle) gives a review of the Bibliography of French Onomatology by K. KOROMPAY. — Mrs. M. MÉSZÁROS— VARGA gives a review of the third volume of the geographical names in Heves county. — E. SZIJ gives a review of the second volume of the street-names in Helsinki. — D. JUHÁSZ gives a review of a volume dealing with the street-names of Szentes. — Mrs. M. MÉSZÁROS-VARGA also writes about a part of a Transsylvanian village monography (Magyarózdi toronyalja) deales with names. — Finally M. HAJDU gives a rewiew of the chapters dealing with proper names in a volume contains Hungarian vernacular legal customs.

The column "Workroom" (Mühely) enlists a part of the manuscripts kept in the Ethnographic Museum.

The column "Observer" (Figyelő) draws the attention to some smaller interesting articles, events in literature.
