

SUMMARY

In the column Studies, Articles, Data (Tanulmányok, Cikkek, Adatok) C. REUTER was continuing an examination of a name-etymology. Earlier, GY. KRISTÓ (NévtÉrt. 4.sz.) examined the origin of the name of a Hungarian village, Kakasd; and identified the German Hahnenburg with the Hungarian 'Kakasvár'. Now, C. REUTER presumed a Hungarian identification through form of Ahnenburg. — GY. DÉNES laid down the exact meaning and places of occurrence of two popular, geographical, common names (árnyék 'shadow' and verő 'bright, sunshine'). — B. RÓNAI proved that scientific research and classification of the popular etymologic explanations that occur in connection with the geographical names is very important. — Z. NÉMETH collected the place names of Taksony, in county Pozsony, in Czechoslovakia; and J. IGYÁRTÓ those of Visk, that belongs to the USSR. — E. LAKATOS classified the street names of Tata, on the basis of the meaning of their first and second parts. — L. BALOGH traced the reminiscences of the old yards among the names of Szamosszeg. — K. FEHÉRTÓI examined the „transitory” name-forms of the XV.—XVI. century notes, that preceded the formation of the Hungarian family names. — Á. SZABÓ T. published the names of the Hungarian students who continued their studies in the University of Franeken, Holland, between 1585—1683. — M. KAKUK examined the personal names of the town Kunszentmárton, in XVII., on basis of the data of ecclesiastic matriculas. — I. SOLYMÁR published an article on the name of Mór Perczel, a one of the generals of the Hungarian Liberational War in 1848/49. — L. BALOGH described the atmospheric changes of personal names on the basis of the changes in the nicknames and property names of three generations. — I. UDVARI put down the etymology of the family name, Dorocki. — G. VARGA classified the XVIII. century family names of village Bokod. — M. FÜREDI made investigations in the first names (Christian names) of

the second half of the XIX. century, in village Sári (now a part of Dabas). — L. MIZSER gave an account of the changes of college names of a secondary-school class at their 5th and 10th years class reunion. — ZS. KARACS compared the college names of two student generations. — K. J. SOLTÉSZ painted an interesting picture of Thomas Mann's literary naming on the basis of the study of Peter de Mendelssohn (*Der Zauberer. Das Leben des deutschen Schriftstellers Thomas Mann*). — K. CSIGÉ systematized the naming customs of the XVIII. century Russian writers on the basis of contemporary onomastic books. — B. VITÁNYI looked for the real family names in the works of István Tömörkény. — N. TERÉNYI collected and classified the names of the Hungarian pop-groups. — J. KISS published a full collection of animal names in Mihályi of Rábaköz. — ZS. J. PAPP gave a collection of the mediaeval Hungarian settlement names which involve water-animal names. — M. HAJDU wrote about the oneitting customs of name-elements in Hungarian.
