

## SUMMARY

In the column Studies, Articles, Data (Tanulmányok, Cikkek, Adatok) L. SZEGFÜ<sup>H</sup> examines the variations of a watername Sugovica, and finds out that the popular etimologies created the name of our time (XV. century: Ruhuz in Old Hungarian 'black, dark' in New Hungarian rüh [ryh] 'scab' = Slawonic suga [ʃuga] 'scab' + ica [itsa] diminutiv suffix > Sugovica). — C. REUTER writes on the rich placenames of the manuscriptal maps. — L. IVÁN gives local date to the verification of the origin of a Hungarian placename Kecel from the Turc qizil 'red'. — Z. NÉMETH publishes the placenames of a Hungarian habitation in Czechoslovakia. — A. BOGNÁR systematizes the types of Hungarian farm-names. — M. HAJDÚ examines the street names of the smaller settlements and he establishes that the scheme of them is more grey and monotonous than of the towns. — A. SZABÓ T. writes on the liquidation of the street-names homonyms in the way of the historical street names of Kolozsvár (Cluj). — L. PÉTER expounds the origin of the family name Szóráth which is very frequent at the settlement Szőreg and he derives it from the Old Polish <sup>\*</sup>Swerad. — L. FÜLÖP systematizes the Hungarian married names in the XVI. century on the basis of contemporaneous letters. — K. CSIGE gives data to Petőfi's literary naming. — D. KOVÁTS examines the proper names of Zsigmond Móricz's works written before 1914. — Zs. J. PAPP gives the explanation of a personal name (Laci) which is frequently encountered in locutions.

— K. J. SOLTÉSZ methodizes with meticulous care the official names of the pedigree cats. — Gy. VIGA writes about the fruit names which are used under the Bükk mountain.

In the column Workroom (Műhely) E. FÖLDI writes on the social foundation of the official geographical names. — F. ÖRDÖG makes known the teaching of the onomatology on the university. — J. MÁTÉ enumerates the onomatological knowledges which are dociles in the secondary schools. — B. OROSZ writes on the possibility of the onomatological education in the elementary schools. — F. FARKAS makes known the onomatological researches in the Jászság (Jazygia). — L. MIZSER gives a bibliography on the onomatological manuscripts which are put in the library of the teachers' institute at Nyíregyháza.

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
